Fr. Gregory Lucey Appointed 19th President

The Very Reverend Joseph D. Sheehan, S.J., Provincial of the Wisconsin Province of the Society of Jesus, announced the appointment of Reverend Gregory F. Lucey, S.J., as the 19th President of Campion Jesuit High School. Father Lucey succeeds the Reverend J. Robert Hilbert, S.J., who served as president since 1966.

along with the presidency.

According to Father Sheehan, this change will bring the administrative arrangement at Cam-

pion in line with those at the other schools in the province outside mission territory. In recent years it has been found preferable to separate the role of religious superior from the administration of the schools.

Father Lucey has been principal of Campion during the past year and will continue to exercise the duties of that office along with the responsibilities of president. Father Hilbert will remain as rector of the Jesuit community at Campion, a position he has held

along with the presidency.

Father Lucey graduated from Campion in 1951, and is the third alumnus to become president, previous presidents were Father Guinta '27 and Father Kalb '41. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. G. C. Lucey of Prairie du Chien, Wis. One of three sons and four daughters born and raised in Southwestern Wisconsin, he attended Campion from 1947-51, as did his brothers Patrick J. '35, and Father J. Roger Lucey, S.J. '45. In 1951, after graduation from Campion, Father Lucey entered the Society of Jesus. He studied at St. Louis University, returned to Campion as a teacher from 1958 to 1961, and then finished his studies at St. Mary's College, Kansas. He was ordained on June 16, 1964.

Among Father Lucey's academic degrees are M.A. in Education from St. Louis, PhL. from St. Louis, and M.A. in Liturgy from Notre Dame. He has done post graduate work in education and worked with the dean of the Liberal Arts School at Marquette University.

1970 Reunions Most Successful

Saturday evening everyone enjoyed cocktails during a cruise down the Mississippi River.

By tradition and necessity, the role of the reporter is to observe rather than to act. Time correspondent, **Robert S.
