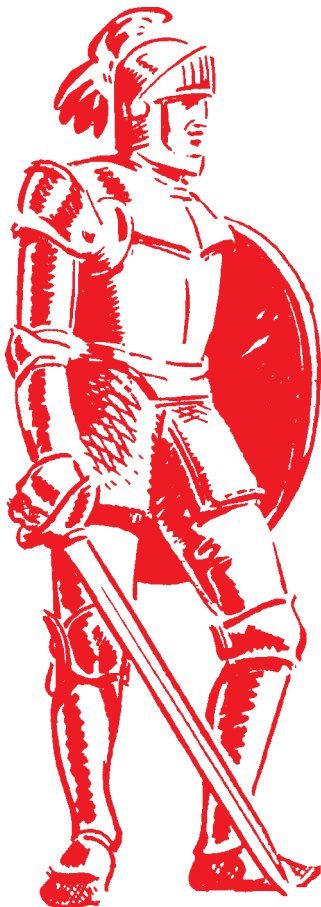

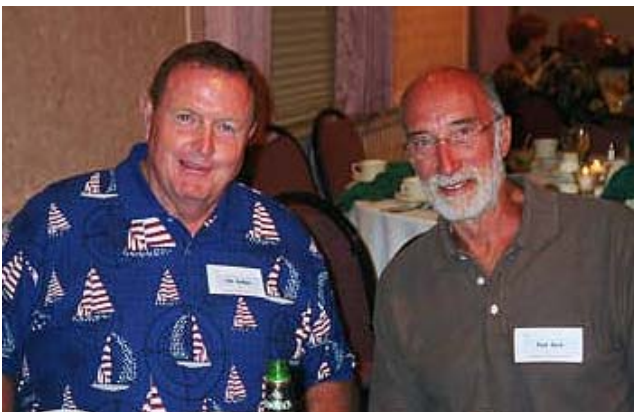

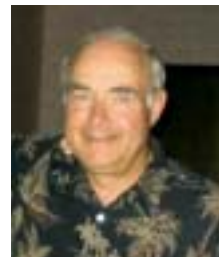


JULE JOHNSON

“After joining the Jesuits and doing the course of studies, I first taught science at Marquette High and then Campion. It was great returning to the home of my guru, Fr. John Scott, who had fascinated me with his demonstrations and got me hooked, giving me a great love for the field. I was trained as a chemist/physic teacher and did graduate work in the earth sciences under a NASA grant and taught these until Campion closed in 1975.

After we closed Campion in 1975, I returned to India to do our final training, but then was assigned to the Sioux Indian Missions in South Dakota. It was after the Wounded Knee Occupation, the time of the American Indian civil rights movement. It was crazy, wild, scary at times, but I came to love the Native Americans and spent 18 years of my life among them.

In 1986, the Wisconsin Province of the Society of Jesus, was asked to "twin" with the Eastern African Province, supplying manpower and funds. I was asked to consider going there. I did, and it has been one of the best decisions of my life and best assignments. I ended up doing spiritual renewal in Uganda for six years, becoming a founding member of the Uganda Spiritual Formation Center. Uganda had just come out of a 17 year civil war. Nothing worked and there had been no training, so we began with a renew program. Six years later we had graduated 186 spiritual directors who became their own agents for renewal.

I came to love the Africans as much as the Sioux. But then, I was asked to return to the States for a year so as not lose touch with America, so I returned to become superior of St. Francis Indian Mission, in South Dakota. After that work I was asked to teach chemistry at Creighton Prep while we upgraded the science department to a state of the art facility. Finally, last year, after several earlier requests, I was

allowed to retire from teaching and to return to African missions. So, here I am again, since Sept. 2001.

I do retreat renewal work and oversee construction of a health care and retirement facility. Construction was one of the many things I learned to do while here and on the other missions. Today, for example, I directed six retreatants in the morning and then in the afternoon, drove tractor, assisting 9 of our men to bring up stones from our quarry.

If you have seen "Out of Africa," Mwangaza Retreat Centre, where I work, is on 40 acres of the original 20,000 acres Karen Blixen established her coffee plantation. When it failed in 1939, it was divided and we eventually bought forty acres including a quarry from which her home and homes around here were built. We are in the highlands above Nairobi, about 6,000 ft above sea level. Although we are only 3 degrees south of the equator, the climate is heavenly, the temperature ranging between 50F on a cold June night to 95F on a hot summer day. It is a little paradise.

If you have read much about Kenya or been here, you will know the economy is a shambles and there are terrific problems. For example, about 60% of the 3 million people in Nairobi are living in slums. There is high unemployment and a very high incidence of AIDS.

There are so many needs. People here are just grateful for work so they can feed their families or educate their children. It is a hard time. So I am grateful for your remembering me and this work.”

He then pursued a doctorate in sociology at Emory U., Ithaca, N.Y., graduating and teaching sociology at Emory. He was then assigned to teach sociology at Creighton University, Omaha, Neb., immediately assuming the position of interim dean of the department, which he held for four years. In 1969 he became acting academic vice-president. At the time of his death he was acting president of Creighton; Clem died from complications resulting from a gall bladder operation. My understanding is that, upon his being opened up for the operation, the liver was found to have an extra (third) lobe which hid the diseased gall bladder. The latter could not be found, or the complications that resulting from the search for it, led to the quite unanticipated death of an otherwise healthy man.
